



He has also recently adapted the script of "Quartet" for film. Quartet first opened in the West End in 1999. Dustin Hoffman is about to make his debut as a director with a film version starring Dame Maggie Smith, Albert Finney and Tom Courtney. What illustrious steps to follow in! Set in a retirement home for musicians. Three elderly former opera-singers, who often worked together, are sitting out

on the terrace. They are about to be joined by a newcomer, a major star in her day and to whom Reginald was once unhappily married. Is there any chance that these four will ever sing together again? A gala concert is about to take place at the retirement home to celebrate Verdi's birthday. Three of the four are keen to recreate the third act quartet from Rigoletto. But the play eventually moves to an uncertain conclusion when they don costumes and lip-synch to their own retro recording."


"HONK!" the Musical

Our Treasurer went Down Under


'Des the ED' scouts around for articles for our Algarvean 'Spotlight Newsletter', so, unaccustomed as I am to ever putting pen to paper (give me figures to work with any day) I thought I would share with you my recent trip to Australia & Singapore. The reason for my visit was to celebrate my sister's 70th birthday, she went to Aus. in 1998 since both her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren live there. I asked my sister Sheila (yes an apt name for an Aus. resident) what she wanted for her birthday and the reply was that she wanted to see 'The Shen Yun Performing Arts' at the Capitol Theatre in Sydney which I duly booked on-line, the cheapest seats being 100\$!!! We met up in Sydney on her birthday and you can imagine, many tears flowed, so after we mopped ourselves up and wrung ourselves out we went on to celebrate !!!! We had to stay sober enough to watch the performance though so didn't overdo it, that came later, but I won't go into that for fear of embarrassment!!!! So what does 'Shen Yun' mean? 'Shen' is a general term for 'divine' or divine being', 'Yun' refers to the overall manner a dancer, a dancer's style, and the meaning behind his or her movements; so it's about grace, compassion and beauty. The show was amazing with many wonderful props and costumes, the backdrop showed performers in the distance on clouds that drew nearer and nearer, and then, in wonderful synchronisation seemed to alight from the clouds and step onto the stage, truly magical.



The Capitol Theatre is stunning, the building started off its life as a market in 1892, then became a circus, later a cinema and eventually fell into disrepair. It was planned to be bulldozed in 1981 but Australia's Heritage Council had a preservation order put on it and plans were made to restore it. For the first time in its history the theatre underwent a complete and thorough restoration that took two years and cost over \$30m to complete. The orchestra pit was expanded with space for 110 musicians.

New dressing rooms and technical areas incorporated part of the old tunnels. It was used by the animals in the theatre's former life, as a hippodrome. So, you can see from the picture above how beautiful it looks, there was a production of Miss Saigon there a few years ago; I would love to have been there then to see it.

I think at this point 'Des the Ed' might be regretting asking for articles! I'm not going to write much about Singapore (other than to say I had afternoon tea at Raffles, you have to when you're there don't you, but didn't



try a 'Singapore Sling', too hung over at this point), since I hadn't meant to go on this long, but want to mention Brisbane. I went there to visit my niece not long after the floods had happened and was amazed at how normal it looked, they certainly must have worked very hard to clean it up, there were no signs of flooding at all; the city looked clean and beautiful. To finish, (yes you can all breathe a sigh of relief), whilst there my niece took me to the 'Ettamogah Pub' about an hour's drive from Brisbane, it was made famous

through Ken Maynard's cartoons, one of his cartoon captions, showing a man on horseback on a mangy mule outside of the pub was, and you need to say this in an Australian accent:
